SATURDAY 14 SEPTEMBER 2019

Those conditions led to the cancellation of all sport on Association Day 2018, and we as the PPA Committee took huge encouragement from the evident disappointment of our members that day.

Despite the weather, we hosted 2 reunions that day. The Class of 1978, with their 3 teachers in attendance, and the Class of 2008 whom we eventually had to request to move on to Stokers 6 hours after the Reunion began.

The Hands through Time podium and ceremony were new introductions that certainly added some tradition and gravity to the Matric Farewell assembly. Thanks to the excellent oratory skills of Colin James, the Class of 2018 truly felt the handprint that Thomas More College leaves on your soul.

The PPA are exceptionally grateful to MANCO for the relocation of the PPA Office. The larger and more inviting space has already been remarked on by every Past Pupil that has popped in.

Our database contains 7018 records which include Past Pupils, Board Members, Past Staff & Past Parents. Of these 63% are active contacts, which is a significant increase from the 56% of last year. Our Facebook Page has 2268 followers, representing 32% of our records.

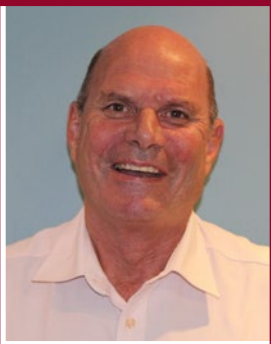

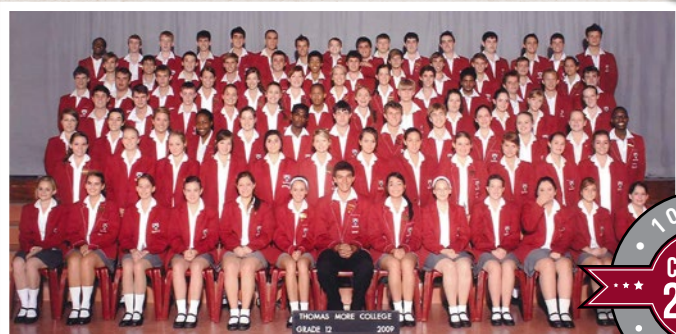

“ If I had to simply sum up Gary... it would be, using his own words, in the dedication of the book he wrote on his time at Thomas More:

“...to the Thomas Matric Class of 1979...” So is his undying love of the school, and his former class mates, many of who are here this morning.

Anyhow... moving on:

I arrived at Thomas More in 1976, having done my Prep Schooling at Kings School in Nottingham Road. Upon my arrival that January, I was warmly received by my classmates, and immediately felt at home.

It didn't take me long to work out the different characters in our Class...

1. the "normal" guys
2. the good sportsmen
3. the (only) three girls... and
4. the "anarchists"! ...Gary being ..."leader of the pack"!!

In the 4 years I spent at Thomas More, there wasn't a fellow pupil or teacher who wasn't put to the ultimate test by Gary. I guess that Gary works you out long before you get the chance to work him out...

If you are the superficial/insincere and a non-team player, that becomes a quick departure point for Gary. But if you get his very special "Green Light" you have his loyalty and friendship for life.

Gary wasn't born with a silver spoon in his mouth... the Thomas More of yesteryear was vastly different from the school today. Gary and many of the boarders, adopted the school as their home, and the friendships he and

others made back then, have stood the test of time, are the best friendships today.

After completing his "entertaining stint" in the army, Gary started out on the very bottom rung of the ladder, in retail clothing. I remember him working as a dress suit salesman, at Nubian Notion in an arcade, off West Street in the early 80's. He then went on to serve his time in the corporate side of clothing manufacture, rising to Management level.

...and now Gary is a highly successful self-made entrepreneur, heading up his own company, which is situated at the top end of the retail clothing industry in the country. He is well known and respected in what is known as the "rag trade".

Gary's passion for Thomas More, and his old school buddies, has seen him organise the Class of '79s, 10/20/30 and now 40yr Reunions... with the help and loyal assistance of Chris Dalzell. Gary has served as Vice Chairman of the TMC Past Pupils' Association, and also serves on the Board of Trustees of Thomas More College, in both the Marketing & Finance portfolios.

As a recipient of the Thomas More Cup in 1979, together with the uninterrupted loyalty to both the school and past pupils since, makes him the true embodiment, of this School's legendary Past Pupils.

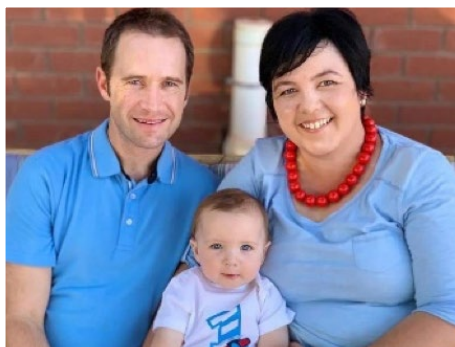

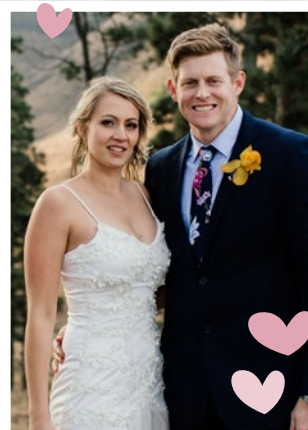

SATURDAY 18TH MAY 2019

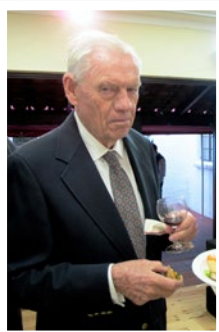

THOMAS More Old Boy, Hendrik Joerges (23) is a DJ/Producer who works with all kinds of artists doing commissions and musicians who need their work to be mixed and mastered.

In 2016, he was added to the annual Ministry of Sound album in 2016.

Joerges isn't just a behind-the-scenes artist, he has been making music under his Hendrik Joerges brand since he was 17 years old.

"I started to see myself having a career in the field rather than seeing it as just a hobby," said the young and versatile beat-maker.

Joerges, who's of German descent, has worked with some of the best artists in the music industry, including collaborations with pop duo, Locnville, House djing duo Pascal and Pearce, Mark Stent, Kyle Deutch and is also being mentored and managed by 5fm DJ, Das Kapital. Joerges looks up to Das Kapital and recognises him as an influential person in his career and personal life.

"Das Kapital approached me when I was 17 after he saw some of my work on Soundcloud and signed me to his management and record labels," said Joerges, who was featured in GQ with Das Kapital, who's real name is Kyle Brinkman.

"After being signed to his label, I started gaining recognition from artists like Locnville and later on Kyle Deutch as well as getting bookings as a DJ all over the country," he said.

Joerges is also responsible for composing the jingle for the East Coast Radio Morning Show with vocalist, Cecil "Styles" Mbatha.

"Styles was approached by the producer of the show and as soon as we got the info, I started to work on the track, but we made it a little longer than it should've been because normally, a jingle is 30 seconds but this one was just under one minute, so it was almost like a theme song," he added.

Joerges made the jingle/theme song in three hours and the producers of the show were impressed with the effort.

"After that process we went to talk to them (East Coast Radio Breakfast show) in the studio and it's such a well organised show. Being there, in that environment definitely made me consider a future in radio," said Joerges.

Hendrik's sound is a hybrid of a lot of different genres and the Flume-inspired producer describes his sound: "It's a mixture of a melodic take on hip-hop and low-fi, especially with my latest work. There's a merge of future bass, drum 'n bass and half time as well as hip hop that's organic."

The underrated producer has work lined up with John Casey from Pretoria and USA-based drum 'n bass pioneer, A112 and Durbanite, Ross Charles.

Even with his impressive roster of his upcoming collaborations that could bring him commercial success, Joerges still wants to bring something unique to the music industry.

"If I can strike a balance between breaking into the commercial scene and still provide something that's unique to what is out there, that'll be perfect for me. I don't want to make music that's already out there," he said.
